San Luis Obispo County Oak Woodland Stewardship Program

The University of California Cooperative Extension and the Native Tree Committee, San Luis Obispo County, are holding a workshop on oak regeneration and rangeland stewardship. Among the topics are oak tree regeneration issues, field trials & projects, and rangeland monitoring (various aspects to help ranchers assess their sustainability). The Sinton family is graciously hosting this event at their Canyon Ranch property. This is one of a series of workshops and field days—Working Among the Oaks—on agricultural stewardship and oak woodland conservation. Working Among the Oaks provides a forum for teaching and learning among the public and agricultural community, with an emphasis on practical expertise.

The goals of the Stewardship Program are to promote:

- Public understanding of oak trees and oak woodlands;
- Appreciation for oaks and offer science-based learning of oak woodland functions and use;
- Large scale oak woodland conservation by promoting good stewardship of working landscapes; and
- Stewardship of oaks on all landscapes throughout the county and beyond.

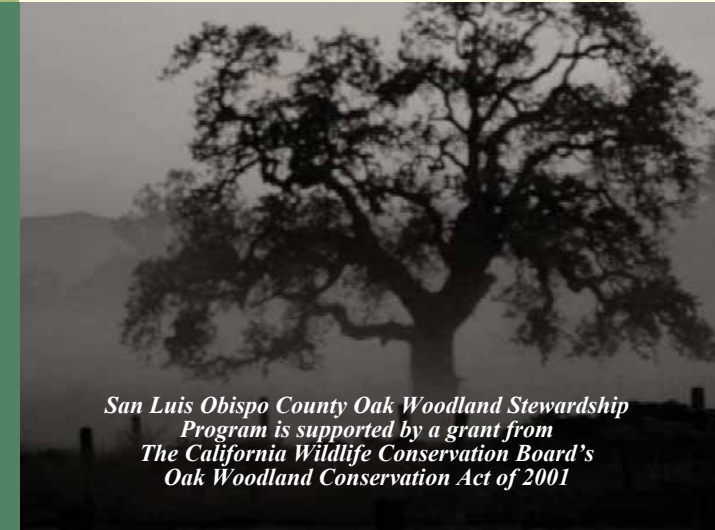

San Luis Obispo County Oak Woodland Stewardship Program

Learning Among the Oaks developed an interpretive trail on 15 acres of the historic Santa Margarita Ranch (SMR) adjacent to the Santa Margarita Elementary School. Learning Among the Oaks provides Santa Margarita School's K-6th grade students with opportunities for hands-on oak woodland studies within the context of a working cattle ranch. Learning Among the Oaks is supported by the SMR, the California Conservation Corps, Santa Margarita 4-H, the Land Conservancy of SLO Co., and many other collaborators.

Both the "Learning Among the Oaks" and "Working Among the Oaks" programs will continue through 2010.

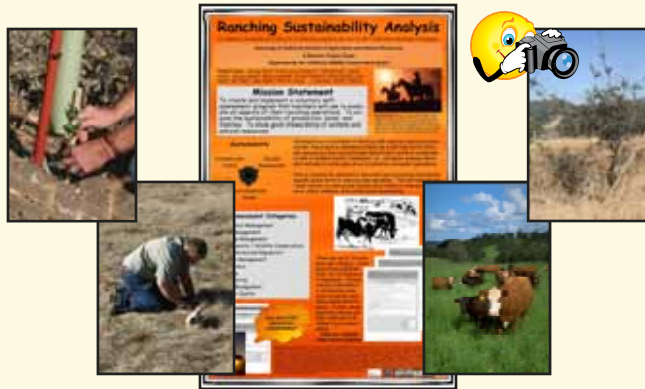
The Sinton Family's Canyon Ranch

Approximately 25-30min drive from Hwy 101. Take the Hwy 58—Santa Margarita Exit (located north of San Luis Obispo and south of Atascadero). Go East through the town of Santa Margarita and at the far end, where the main street curves left, turn right to cross the railroad tracks and continue on Hwy 58 (also Estrada Ave). Follow for 19.1 miles to Shell Creek Road. We will meet at the junction and coordinate from there.
